Community Solar

- H.B. 531
- Under this bill, homeowners, renters, and property owners would be able to subscribe to a portion of an off-site solar project and receive credits on their electricity bills for the power that is produced
- This would open solar to more low- and moderate-income residents who may otherwise not be able to afford solar energy systems
