Nutting's dedication to giving back to the community in every aspect of his life has brought a refocused philanthropic commitment to the Pirates organization. For more than 15 years, Nutting has led Pirates Charities community outreach efforts that continue to make a deep and lasting impact off the field.

Shortly after assuming control of the team, Nutting successfully implemented environmentally responsible practices throughout the Pirates organization. The "Let's Go Bucs. Let's Go Green" sustainability program has engaged millions of baseball fans in environmental awareness. The nationally recognized program has achieved, among other things, a waste diversion rate of more than 80 percent.

In 2013, the Natural Resources Defense Council awarded Nutting with the Game Changer Award for his leadership in the sports industry's movement to adopt sustainable business practices. In 2022, he was also named as Sports Business Journal's 10 executives to watch in sustainability who are leading planet-conscious actions across the sports industry.

Her work focuses on building community around sustainability topics, with a particular interest in making important scientific, technical, or complex information accessible and useful.
